

Clean up helpers for Saint Peter Residents!

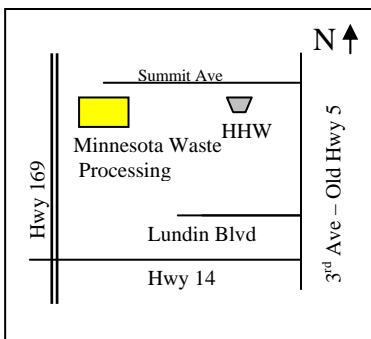
Friday, June 1st, **Curbside appliance pickup** - \$15 each. Stop in the Finance Department at City Hall, 227 S Front Street, to register and pay for your appliance **by Wednesday, May 30th**. You must register in advance for this collection.

Saturday, June 2nd, **Curbside furniture pickup**- Mattress/box spring \$15 per piece; sofa, desk, or cabinet \$17; hide-a-bed \$30; chairs \$12 each; miscellaneous \$7. Stop in the Finance Department, 227 South Front Street to register and pay for your furniture pickup **by Wednesday, May 30th**. You must register in advance for this collection.

Saturday, June 2nd, **Electronics recycling** will be conducted at the City's wastewater treatment plant located at 400 West St. Julien Street from 10 am to 1 pm. Prices range from **free to \$30** for televisions, computers and household electronics. See reverse side for individual item pricing.

****New this year**** Saturday, June 2nd, **Free bicycle recycling** will be provided alongside the electronics recycling at 400 West St. Julien from 10 am to 1 pm. All bicycles and bike parts will be accepted. Bikes will be refurbished or recycled by an area non-profit organization, depending on the condition.

Regional Household Hazardous Waste Facility and Product Reuse Center is open at 651 Summit Avenue in Mankato. Open every Tuesday, April – October, from noon – 6:00 p.m. and the second Saturday of each month, April – October, from 8 am – 12:30 p.m. This service is open to Nicollet County residents.
